Today's study can be found in <u>1 Samuel chapters 1-17</u>, please take the time to **read it** and only use my summary of the text as just that ... a summary.

This is one of my favorite stories, and one of the many instances in the scriptures that we see obedience is what God requires. <u>Very far from the second, third, fourth, and sixteenth chance teachings that we witness being ministered today.</u>

Samuel appointed Saul to be king just as God had instructed him. But Saul followed his own instructions and did what he as well as the people felt was right. Finally, the lord relented that he had chosen Saul to be king (as Samuel prophesied at the start) and because he is God, and he doesn't have to relent about anything he sent Samuel to Jessie's house to anoint a new king whom the lord had chosen himself. After Jessie put all his sons (I am assuming he introduced them in order of his own preferences) Samuel says none of the sons are the one whom God has appointed. Jessie then tells Samuel of David who is tending to the sheep and then David is anointed. The spirit of the lord (the mantle of a king) now comes upon David and therefore leaves Saul. When this happens Saul is troubled & because of this troubled spirit that comes upon him he searches for a harp player. What he is unaware of is that the harp player that he has chosen has been anointed by God to replace him. David finds favor with Saul & I would imagine has a residence in the king's company so that any time he is troubled David can play the harp. Again, what he is unaware of is the fact that a situation is about to be presented that would move David from being the harp player into the position that the lord has anointed him for.

Have you ever found yourself in a situation like Saul? You hear the word of the Lord, but you sift through the instructions until they best suit your plans.
